## PLENARY ROUNDTABLES, 12 JULY 2023

EWIS starts with two plenary roundtables based on the workshop theme – ‘**Are we doomed? Rethinking War and Peace in World Politics**’. The roundtables follow the EISA’s founding mission of thematic, theoretical and methodological plurality. Different from the conventional keynote format, we bring together scholars with diverse areas of expertise in a plenary format to foster dialogue and exchange of perspectives. In the setting up of the plenary panels, we have sought to pay particular attention to academic inclusion and diversity in terms of, inter alia, seniority, gender and geographical origin.

The first roundtable is entitled **Futures of and New Directions in Gender and Security**. Attention to security's gendered dynamics have proliferated over the past forty years. Scholarship in these areas has often focused on gender-based violence during armed conflicts, on the gendered nature of states and inter-state relationships, gendered peace activism, and on gendered experiences during war. More recently, scholars have expanded the scope of research to study previous under-studied areas including, for example, everyday practices of gendered political violence and queerness as a central dynamic of gendered security relationships. How might the study of gender and security continue to develop? How do well-established frameworks inform new directions, and how might new work improve upon what we know? This plenary brings together experts on gender and security with innovative research agendas to discuss, explore, and imagine the futures of this field.



The second roundtable is entitled **War and Security 20 Years on from the US Invasion of Iraq**. 20 years have passed since the invasion of Iraq. This panel will reflect on questions of war and security sparked by the 2003 US-led war that overthrew the Iraqi government of Saddam Hussein with important consequences for regional and international politics. Rich debates have unfolded within IR research to understand and analyze the ways in which modern warfare and international security have evolved and transformed in the last two decades. Speakers of this panel have contributed to academic debates on the topic from a wide range of perspectives, including, for example, the entanglement of the private and public; international political economy; international law; colonialism and racism; and materialities and technologies. In this plenary, they will offer different theoretical and methodological perspectives to discuss war and security 20-years on from the US invasion of Iraq.



