Dear EWIS participant,

Welcome to our first virtual workshops! The European Workshops in International Studies (EWIS) were launched by EISA at the University of Tartu, Estonia, in 2013. The 8th iteration of EWIS is an event we would have not imagined two years ago when we announced the theme. Inspired by John Lennon's famous song, we imagined a gathering of our community members to share new ideas, to discuss ongoing project, and to develop new collaborations. The global pandemic turned our academic and private life upside down.

EWIS have quickly established themselves as a vivacious place for the European IR community and beyond to engage in sustained, in-depth discussion with a diverse range of peers from various institutions, countries, disciplines, and career stages. EWIS has proven to be a popular and productive format, perfect for preparing special issues, edited volumes or exploring new ideas, themes, and directions in a vibrant and friendly atmosphere. We believe that it is this spirit that will make EWIS 2021 an unforgettable event!

EWIS 2021 was scheduled for Thessaloniki, Greece, at the University of Macedonia. With a heavy heart we announced in January 2021 that the workshops will be hosted online. A thorough assessment of the situation left us with little hope that an on-site event in Thessaloniki was realistic and feasible. We are all yearning to meet friends and colleagues over coffees and dinners instead of sharing screens and chatting in virtual spaces. However, we believe that the workshops help to narrow the void between people that might have grown in times of social distancing and online only teaching and research collaborations.

Virtual meetings cannot compensate or imitate the spirit of an on-site event. But hosting virtual workshops gives us the opportunity to include more participants. Many workshops accepted for our postponed meeting in Brussels in 2020 moved to EWIS 2021. After a second call, we accepted five additional workshops. This year's event is the biggest EWIS we ever had with over 400 participants for the workshops! The workshops that we selected will provide not only manifold explorations of the EWIS 2021 umbrella theme but hopefully shape a global academic community devoted to the aims of EISA. Our plenary panels will gaze into the crystal ball of the future of International Relations and a world after COVID-19

With the 8th iteration of the event, we are delighted to welcome thirty-two forward-looking workshops and their participants, while maintaining the intimate spirit of EWIS and its small-group workshop format. We hope to further consolidate EWIS' reputation as the most intellectually productive IR conference format in Europe – and one that supports inclusive participation.

Organizing a social programme that accomplishes the workshops has been the most difficult challenge for us. Neither a welcome reception, joint dinners, happy hours, or cultural excursions in and around Thessaloniki can be easily metamorphosed to a virtual space. Our access to the knowledge and skills of Greek gods and goddesses was unfortunately limited. EISA announced that EWIS 2023 will take place in Thessaloniki to introduce this vibrant city, its lovely people, and our colleagues at the University of Macedonia to you in person. And next year, we can hopefully meet in person in Athens for our PEC 2022!

All of this would not have been possible without the hard work behind the scenes by the workshop conveners, the staff of EISA, as well as eager helpers on both sides. We trust that you will all join us thanking them for their work.

We hope you enjoy the event, and look forward to meeting you, catching up – and to getting your feedback – at EWIS 2021 or one of our future events.

Plenary Roundtables, 30 June 2021: ‘Imagine all the people sharing all the world’ – Visions of International Relations

Panel I - Imagine a Global IR - 16:00-17:30

Panel II - Re-imagining the World after the Covid19 Pandemic? - 18:00-19:30

EWIS 2021 kicks off with two plenary roundtables exploring the convention theme – ‘Imagine all the people sharing all the world’ – Visions of International Relations. While we have chosen the theme at a time when COVID-19 was unknown, the roundtables pick up its key message to imagine a different world. We continue the democratic spirit introduced at EWIS 2018 in Groningen: we will deliberately depart from the conventional keynote format by bringing together scholars from a broad variety of perspectives to showcase the bottom-up dialogical character of EWIS as a whole. We are excited to welcome leading scholars and rising stars from around the world to participate in these roundtable discussions. It is our hope that the two plenaries will provide a welcome spark for the ensuing workshops in the next two days.

The first roundtable will focus on globalizing International Relations as a discipline, practice, and field of experience. The globe itself is an imagination, a spherical model of the Earth. It is multi-dimensional, shaped by different centers, and varies depending on perspectives. Decentering the discipline of International Relations (IR) is an ongoing endeavor that aims for a more diverse, multiple, and creative view on relational configurations within the Global South as well as between the Global South and the Global North. This panel intends to reflect the challenges, opportunities, and limits of globalizing IR: What does Global IR mean? How can disciplinary discourses and practices become more inclusive, reflexive, and diverse? How can ‘we’ build an academic community where knowledge produced in different social and regional areas is flourishing?

The second roundtable’s aim is to discuss COVID-19 as a global problem and explore the transformations and challenges the pandemic has brought about in Europe and elsewhere. The key question is whether the COVID-19 pandemic has been a game-changer. Although this can be a hard to answer and open-ended puzzle, our goal will be facilitated by starting our discussion from topics that have been very popular among our academic community during the last year. Our focus is on status competition between great powers but also among small states, the nexus between technology, digitalization, security and civil rights, structural flaws of global capitalism, and the EU’s preparedness to confront one more crisis inside and outside its borders.
