

# SEMI-PLENARIES, 2 JULY 2025



## Roundtable 1 In-between space: Central Eastern Europe, liminality and changing world orders

*In the context of changing world orders, this roundtable focuses on the spatial dimensions of liminality, in-betweenness and ambiguity. It does so by speaking from Central Eastern Europe (CEE) — as the location of this year's workshops - while also situating this region within the multiplicity of global entanglements that characterise it. The role of Central Eastern Europe in world politics has always been multifaceted and shaped by its historical context, geopolitical significance, and its evolving identity within international relations. This region has historically served as a buffer zone between major powers. CEE is often cast as such a transitional, liminal space — but also now more and more constitutive of global dynamics and a transition to a global order that is being clearly shaped by Central and Eastern Europe. Thus, the goal of this roundtable is to focus on CEE not as a place where IR happens but as a place that constitutes IR and shapes the changing global world order. The roundtable asks: how does a focus on the in-between and liminality shape our view of global politics from Central Eastern Europe? How is CEE situated alongside and in relation to other liminal regions or transitional spaces? How do situated knowledges from CEE and other liminal regions or transitional spaces constitute global politics and changing world orders?*

## Roundtable 2 In-between time: making sense of crisis and transition

*This roundtable tackles the temporal dimensions of liminality and in-betweenness. From Trump's re-election and problematic negotiations between Russia and Ukraine to the breakdown of ceasefires in Gaza and Lebanon, and from democratic backsliding and the rolling back of women's, LGBTQ+ and minority rights to the return or rearmament and austerity, global politics seem to be in a transitional phase where upheavals, transformations and dislocations of social, political and economic life challenge our ability to define and interpret our current moment. This roundtable thus explores how international studies, broadly understood, can learn to grapple with, and make sense of, transitional or ambiguous states between war and peace, democracy and authoritarianism, economic crisis and recovery, climate catastrophe and survival, and even life and death. It asks questions about the changing role of institutions, law and norms, about hybridity, and the intersection of late capitalism with the climate crisis 'tipping point'. The roundtable asks: in this global context, how do we theorise transitions, their beginnings, trajectories and desired end goals? How is ambiguity exploited in moments of crisis, and how do we make space for the possibility of positive change in the future? How can our work foster solidarity and justice, in a context where academia itself is caught between threats to academic freedom and pressures to bolster unjust world orders?*


## 👋 WELCOME RECEPTION



## AUDITORIUM MAXIMUM FLOORPLANS








# REYMONTA BUILDING FLOORPLAN





# DIRECTIONS

## ARRIVING FROM THE AIRPORT

If not using a taxi, the cheapest and most convenient route from the airport to Auditorium Maximum of Jagiellonian University is taking a bus. Kraków Airport is served by three regular bus lines: 209, 300, and one night line: 902. We also recommend the same lines to get to Reymonta Street (Faculty of International and Political Studies Building).

These are AGGLOMERATION BUS LINES. The route takes approximately 35 minutes. We also recommend taking the train from Kraków Balice Airport, which can take you to the Central Station (Kraków Główny).

## ARRIVING FROM THE MAIN RAILWAY STATION

While arriving to the Kraków main railway station (Kraków Główny), there are two most convenient ways for getting to the Auditorium Maximum and the Faculty of International and Political Studies building (Reymonta Street). The first option is to take public transportation. There are multiple lines which go from the nearby Politechnika station to the AGH / UR station, which is just 200 meters from the Auditorium Maximum and 350 meters from the Faculty building. To get to the Faculty of International and Political Studies, we recommend using bus line 179, also to the AGH/UR stop.

The alternative is walking. The Auditorium Maximum is approximately 2.5 km away from the station, which is a 30-minute walk, whereas the Faculty Building is 2.8 km away. The route goes around the historical walls of the city of Kraków, with the possibility to make a short detour through the historical center itself.
