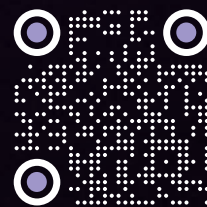

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Welcome

EISA's Welcome

Dear Colleagues,

Welcome to the 19th Pan-European Conference (PEC) of the European International Studies Association, and welcome to Lisbon! Our programme chairs have borrowed their question – *even better than the real thing?* – from a rather famous song and turned it into a theme about how we come to know what we claim to know. It is a fitting question to arrive with, and over four days the panels will answer it with all the seriousness it deserves. Allow us, before they begin, a simpler answer of our own. To us, there is nothing quite like the real thing – all of you here at PEC, in one place. However you came to be here – a first PEC or your fifteenth, travelling from far away or teaching just down the road – we are grateful that you are here.

We also want to acknowledge those whose abstracts we couldn't accommodate. Interest in PEC has been overwhelming, outstripping even our best efforts to accommodate everyone. Our programme and section chairs faced the difficult task of selecting from a record number of submissions, welcoming 2 000 participants across 66 sections, 487 panels, and 103 roundtables – more than any PEC before it. We are grateful for your patience and understanding as our community continues to grow, and we hope to welcome those we could not host this time back to PEC very soon.

There is something fitting about asking this year's questions in the city of Lisbon. When the great earthquake levelled Lisbon on All Saints' Day 1755, it shook more than the ground: it drew Voltaire, Rousseau, and Kant into a long argument over who could explain such a catastrophe, and by what authority – divine providence or the new natural sciences. Few cities have staged so publicly the question of how we come to know the world, and whose account of it we are asked to trust.

Today, these questions reach us with unusual urgency. In an age when generative AI can produce a plausible source, a convincing image, or an entire argument on demand, the line between the authentic and the synthetic, between what is known and what is merely fabricated, has become blurred. Philosophical debates about knowledge and authenticity, and how we tell the real thing from its imitation are now a daily, practical challenge for everyone who teaches, writes, and reviews.

Few questions could matter more to the kind of association we hope to be. To ask whose knowledge counts, from which position, and by what claim to authority, is in the end to ask who belongs in our field and on what terms. Our answer is a plural one. EISA is at its best when it is international, when it makes room for different traditions, methods, and voices, and when scholars long kept at the margins of IR find themselves at its centre. Inclusion, diversity, and pluralism are the point of this conference, and the measure by which we hope it will be judged. In that same spirit, the Board is glad to announce the adoption of a new code of conduct, expressing a shared commitment to making EISA events inclusive spaces where everyone can take part with dignity, safety, and mutual respect.

Our conference does not happen in a vacuum, and we meet again in a world that gives us little rest. The violence and upheaval that troubled us at previous conferences have not gone away, and many of you will spend this week thinking hard about them. We will not

rehearse that list here; your panels will do it with far more care. What we will say is that PEC has always been a place to diagnose the world and to consider how we might act within it as scholars, mentors, teachers – individually as well as collectively.

That commitment shows up most concretely in who we are able to bring to Lisbon. We are especially proud that this year EISA has awarded more grants than ever before – **109 grants, amounting to € 93,794** – alongside our continued support for early career colleagues and for the standing sections building connection beyond the conference itself. A conference is only as inclusive as its guest list, and we are glad this one is our most open yet.

There is a great deal to take part in over these four days. The conference opens on **Tuesday 1 September** with the Opening Ceremony and the main Plenary, and closes on **Friday 4 September**; along the way you will find two Semi-Plenaries on **Thursday 3 September** and a rich Early Career Development programme. Among the special events, we are proud to host a session on Palestine Studies – as urgent as any gathering we will convene, and a pointed reminder that questions of whose knowledge counts, whose testimony is heard, and whose reality is granted presence are never merely academic, least of all now.

We will also come together to honour the memory of **A. J. R. “John” Groom**, who played a formative organisational role in the early days of EISA and did so much to build the community we now take for granted. We are proud to celebrate his legacy. On Tuesday, after the opening ceremony we meet for our plenary session on producing knowledge in International Relations. For a different take on this year’s theme, we especially recommend the special event **Film Projection and Debate with Filipa César**. It is her work and method that speaks to us. In *Spell Reel*, César takes a fragile archive of anti-colonial cinema and reactivates it – digitising decaying reels, screening them with live commentary, and returning them to the communities that first made them, so that each screening becomes an act of collective re-authorship. Hers is a way of producing knowledge that keeps asking who holds the camera and from which position the record is assembled. Few practices put our questions of positionality and authority to work as directly and creatively. A *Meet the Editors* session with the OUP–EISA *Voices in IR* book series rounds out the programme.

We strongly encourage EISA members to join the **General Assembly over lunch on Wednesday 2 September**, where we will take stock of the year behind us and, together, shape what the association does next. And to celebrate the community that all of this is for, we very much hope to see you at the **Grand Reception on Thursday 3 September**, which follows two semi-plenaries with a line-up of fantastic speakers.

Finally, our thanks. To our local and welcoming hosts at ISCTE, **Ana Mónica Fonseca** and **Giulia Daniele**, whose work has made it possible for this conference to take place in Lisbon; to our programme chairs, **Nizar Messari** and **Lisa Gaufrman**, for a programme as ambitious as its title; to the Early Career Development Group, our colleagues from the EISA Governing Board, and our management company C-IN, whose care holds the whole thing together. And, above all, to you, for your submissions, your presence, and your continued belief in PEC as a scholarly community worth building. It is a privilege to convene it.

We wish you a wonderful PEC 2026 and a memorable few days in Lisbon.

Programme Chairs' Welcome

Dear colleagues,

Sejam bem-vindes à 19 edição da Conferência Pan-Europeia de Relações Internacionais em Lisboa. Welcome to the 19th edition of the Pan-European Conference on International Relations in Lisbon. This year's conference theme, **"Even better than the real thing? Questioning knowledge production, positionality, and authenticity in International Relations,"** invites us to reflect on some of the most fundamental questions facing our discipline. We have an outstanding lineup of speakers slated for the plenary and semi-plenaries that are geared towards the theme in case you did not read the call for papers.

We hope that it is clear that a conversation about knowledge production as a central theme of PEC is long overdue. The ongoing wars in the world have not only transformed international politics but also generated fierce contestation over evidence, expertise, and whose accounts of violence are recognized as credible. The rapid and unregulated diffusion of generative artificial intelligence has blurred the boundaries between human and machine-produced knowledge, raising new questions about authorship, authenticity, and academic integrity in both research and teaching. At the same time, despite the strong evidence of the causal link between human activity and each time stronger heat waves and major and stronger floodings in some regions while others suffer with unusual drought, many policy makers still consider climate change a hoax and largely exaggerated. Across many democracies, the spread of misinformation and declining trust in scientific and public institutions have further challenged the authority of expertise, while attacks on academic freedom in countries around the world, even in places that have often been considered bastions of freedom of speech, remind us that knowledge production is never insulated from political power, in fact, it has always been a part and parcel of it and the kind of knowledge it produces. Together, these developments reinforce the urgency of examining how knowledge is produced, validated, and contested and of asking how International Relations can foster more reflexive, inclusive, and responsible scholarship in an increasingly fragmented world.

In order to frame these discussions and explore ways to deal with these debates, we invited colleagues from our community to contribute to one plenary session and two semi-plenaries. We hesitate to rank them, but the conference theme does invite us to question knowledge production. The distinction between plenaries and semi-plenaries is, perhaps, an invitation to reflect on the hierarchy of knowledge itself. We encourage you to test this assumption empirically over the next few days by attending them. The theme of the plenary is "Producing knowledge about international relations" and colleagues are invited to reflect on the impact of the field of International Relations and how it actively produces and legitimizes particular forms of knowledge about the world. One of the semi-plenaries will look into "Positionality and authenticity in IR" and how knowledge is shaped by the social, political, and historical locations from which it is produced, which might force

you to start your next paper with a much longer methodological reflexion; while the other semi-plenary will focus on “Technologies of Knowledge” and on the epistemological and ethical concerns that result from the use of technology. Whether you are more interested in positionality or technology, authenticity or algorithms, we hope you will find at least one semi-plenary that is, in the spirit of the conference theme, even *better than the real thing*.

We were truly overwhelmed by the number of applicants to the conference this year: there are 619 panels scheduled and almost 2000 participants expected over 66 sections. Section chairs had to work with many constraints to accommodate as many participants as possible, but even despite the all-time high number of attendees and contributions, there were many tough decisions that had to be made. Yet, we do not credit the record number of submissions entirely to the theme of the conference or the beautiful setting in Portugal, which was probably a more important factor. There were many who submitted proposals because other academic fora had become inaccessible to them, whether due to funding cuts, shifting institutional priorities, travel restrictions, shrinking academic freedoms, or broader geopolitical uncertainties. While we are grateful that EISA-PEC could provide a venue for many of these conversations, this trend is also a reminder that opportunities for international scholarly exchange are becoming increasingly uneven, which, in its turn, impacts the production of knowledge and its validation, perpetuating the marginalization, even the silencing and eventual undermining of the knowledge produced by some scholars.

Specifically, we want to acknowledge those who had hoped to join us but could not. Despite the international nature of our community, barriers to participation remain all too real and both program co-chairs have experienced them first hand. Visa denials and delays, financial constraints, and broader inequalities in global mobility continue to prevent many colleagues from attending. These obstacles are not unfortunate exceptions but recurring reminders that the production and circulation of academic knowledge remain profoundly unequal, with opportunities often shaped by where people are born, where they hold citizenship, and the resources available to them. As a scholarly community, we must continue to reflect on these exclusions and work collectively toward more accessible and equitable forms of participation.

The work that went into the program has not been carried just by us. We would like to acknowledge and thank the section chairs for their hard work under the challenging conditions we mentioned above. We also want to warmly thank Sibel Karadağ and Rens Van Munster, EISA Governing Board Liaisons, for their continuous support throughout the process of preparing this program. Daniela Lai, EISA President, and Nora El Qadim, from EISA Governing board, were also constantly present and supportive in key moments. Ana Mónica Fonseca and Giulia Daniele, our partners from the local organizing team at Iscte – University Institute of Lisbon, were constantly helpful and forthcoming, whereas our colleagues from the C-In team, and in particular Barbora Smejkalová, Tereza Dvořáková and Jan Jež didn't save time or energy and were all the time responsive regarding our multiple requests, responding to our inquiries promptly and professionally.

We wish you an intellectually stimulating and enriching experience in Lisbon!

Plenary Description:

International Relations is not merely a field that studies global politics; it is also a field that actively produces and legitimizes particular forms of knowledge about the world.

Yet, the authority of academic expertise, the status of evidence, and the boundaries between knowledge and opinion are increasingly contested. At a time marked by geopolitical upheaval, disinformation, epistemic fragmentation, and growing scepticism toward institutions, questions about how knowledge is produced and validated have acquired renewed urgency.

The objective of the plenary is to simultaneously engage with and reflect on the evolution of knowledge production in the field of international relations.

In this plenary, we invite the speakers to reflect on the epistemological and ontological diversity and richness of the field and indicate the new directions the study of international relations has adopted over the last two decades.

The plenary aims at going beyond the celebration of the pluriverse in which we live and ponder about the challenges, often violent, this diversity encounters and the risks it entails.

Plenary Description:

Over the past decades, scholars of International Relations have increasingly recognized that knowledge is shaped by the social, political, and historical locations from which it is produced.

Concepts such as positionality, reflexivity, and situated knowledge have challenged claims of neutrality and universality, drawing attention to the power relations embedded in academic inquiry.

Yet these developments raise new questions about authenticity, representation, and authority.

This semi plenary brings two key challenges in social sciences in general, and in IR in particular: the importance of positionality, of agency and of authorship, and the authenticity of the knowledge produced, the latter being a central theme of the conference.

In times of affirmation of the legitimacy of different ways of knowing and debates on mimicking and universality of knowledge, but also in times of generative artificial intelligence, the duality of positionality and authenticity is dealt with from different perspectives by the contributors of this semi-plenary.

Plenary Description:

Technologies have always shaped how knowledge is produced, stored, circulated, and evaluated. Today, however, the rapid expansion of digital infrastructures and generative artificial intelligence is transforming academic work in unprecedented ways. From data collection and analysis to writing, reviewing, teaching, and publishing, new technologies are redefining both the practices and politics of knowledge production.

Beyond questions of efficiency and innovation, the session also addresses broader epistemological and ethical concerns. Whose knowledge is embedded in technological systems? How do digital platforms reproduce or challenge existing inequalities in global knowledge production? What forms of bias, exclusion, or epistemic dependence emerge when academic work relies on technologies developed within specific political, linguistic, and economic contexts?

The semi-plenary focuses and problematizes the centrality of the dichotomy between technology and knowledge. Contributors to this semi-plenary will discuss the place of technology in knowledge production while problematizing it, as some will also focus on the negative sides of technologies in the contemporary world.

Contributors will also discuss a diverse range of technologies that are (ab)used in producing knowledge.
